Range Safety Orientation: Was held at the July 9th meeting and if offered again October 3 @ 6:30 before the membership meeting.

Eagle Scout Project: Larry Shepard's son Griffin – collected enough donations to continue with 3 benches. The Scouts approvals should be finishing up and he will be starting the project this month.

FY 25 Grant Application: According to the new ODNR Online Application, we were awarded all the money we asked for (\$13,962.00) to fund Grant events starting this fall and next spring. So, our events for FY25 are as follows: They are open to the public and free.

The Outdoor Quick Response Triage class is a course that covers Bleeds and the control of the various types of bleeds, proper application of dressings & tourniquets, as well as how to identify shock and its treatment. Participants will learn proper dressings & treatment with hands on practice, and will be able to practice on dummy tools, or “mannequins”. The course is also designed to help shooters & hunters to work with others to interact with EMS, and direct EMS to the scene of the accident in case of injury.

Gravel Yard Lease Agreement: After some negotiations, we have an official lease agreement for the Delaware County gravel yard: (Thanks John Faber!). The lease has the club receiving \$24,000 every 3 years to make up for the work the County did to help maintain our driveway and mounds of gravel. It breaks down to receiving \$8,000 per year for 3 years. The driveway will be maintained at a date to be determined.

Delaware County Water

We are still evaluating getting a Delaware County water tap and meter behind the clubhouse. Nothing is approved, we are just getting information and prices.

*Dave Crates volunteered to speak to -and got us the packet from Delaware County re: the cost and what to expect. \$5,410 for the tap and meter. With \$1,085 down payment and the rest payable with the regular monthly payment plus \$100 with the water bill monthly until that's paid off.

*He met with Worley Supply (who Delaware County works with) –for a complete list of supplies with a quote - \$3,042.03

*So, \$8,542 total – but only need to come up with \$4,127.00 then monthly payments with the water bill.

*Dave is setting up a meeting with Delco to come to our property to explain and to answer questions.
